**DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)**

This is an application for a Manager's Certificate by **Jeanette Francis Robertson**. The application is supported with a copy of the required Licensed Controller Qualification and the Licensed Controller Qualification Bridging Test.

Section 222 of the Act provides that in considering an application for a manager's certificate the Licensing Committee must have regard for the following matters:

- (a) the applicant's suitability to be a manager:
- (b) any convictions recorded against the applicant:
- (c) any experience, in particular recent experience, that the applicant has had in controlling any premises for which a licence was in force:
- (d) any relevant training, in particular recent training, that the applicant has undertaken and evidence that the applicant holds the prescribed qualification required under section 218:
- (e) any matters dealt with in any report made under section 220.

The committee has received reports on the application from the Police and the Licensing Inspector and neither has raised matters in opposition. Accordingly the committee deals with the matters on the papers.

The applicant is currently employed as bar person for Waipu Returned Service Association, which holds a club licence. She was granted a manager's certificate under the Sale of Liquor Act 1989 by the Whangarei District Licensing Agency in June 2008 as she was the owner and operator of Cove Café in Waipu. She did not renew the manager's certificate because she has sold the business.

The committee is satisfied as to the matters to which it must have regard as set out in s.222 of the Act and the application is granted. The certificate may issue immediately, expiring at the close of the day twelve months after the day of issue.
