DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is an application by **Kylie Wech** on behalf of Contractors for Charity Northland, dated 22 August 2014, for an on-site special licence in respect of **ASB Leisure Centre** premises situated at **97 Western Hill Drive, Whangarei** for an event described as the **Charity Boxing Event**.

The day and hours sought for the event are: 13th September 2014 from 5.00pm until 12.00midnight. The boxing ring is to be set up in the centre of the hall, with corporate seating arrangements surrounding the ring and also bleachers for more spectators. Approximately 800 people are expected to attend. This boxing event has been held for the last two years without any reported incidences.

Kylie Wech has applied on behalf of Contractors for Charity Northland. This charity was set up in 2012 by Downer NZ, Fulton Hogan, Transfield Services and United Civil Construction. The idea behind setting up the charity was to allow the local contracting industry to give back to their communities. Contractors for the Charity run two events each year – Corporate Boxing and a Local Authorities Golf day.

Kylie Wech is the overall event organizer, Hurupaki Taekwondo and Sports Fit are in charge of security and door sales, Tim Bowman is the boxing manager in charge of competitors and medical staff and Brad Flower (002/CM/24/2013) is the bar manager and canteen manager. The police have not questioned the suitability of the applicant.

Brad Flower (002/CM/24/2013) is the overall duty manager, he will have experienced staff assisting him. Bar staff will serve and also collect glasses from tables which will allow monitoring of the patrons. Security will also be used to monitor patrons. Four volunteers from the Hurupaki Taekwondo and Sports Fit club will provide door security on the night. They are experienced and volunteered for the previous boxing event last year.

The bar staff (volunteers) are required to read and sign the acknowledgement of alcohol management plan prior to first commencing work.

The applicant has provided an Alcohol Management Plan detailing risk management, provision of food, low and non-alcoholic beverages, certificated managers and bar staff requirements, transport options and accidents/incidents management.

The committee has received reports on the application from the Police, the Medical Officer of Health and the Licensing Inspector and none have raised matters in opposition. Furthermore the application did not require public notice. Accordingly the committee deals with the matters on the papers.

In deciding whether to issue a special licence, the District Licensing Committee must have regard to the criteria set down in section 142 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. Section 143 further requires the committee to have regard to the additional requirements for large-scale events. Read together these matters are as follows:

Section 142 Criteria for issue of special licences

(1) In deciding whether to issue a special licence, the licensing committee concerned must have regard to the following matters:

- (a) the object of this Act:*
- (b) the nature of the particular event for which the licence is sought and, in particular,—*
 - (i) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes at the event to engage in, the sale of goods other than alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which goods; and*
 - (ii) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes at the event to engage in, the provision of services other than those directly related to the sale of alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which services:*
- (c) the suitability of the applicant:*
- (d) any relevant local alcohol policy:*
- (e) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be reduced, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence:*
- (f) the days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol:*
- (g) the design and layout of the premises concerned:*
- (h) whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law:*
- (i) any areas of the premises that the applicant proposes should be designated as restricted areas or supervised areas:*
- (j) any steps the applicant proposes to take to ensure that the requirements of this Act in relation to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:*
- (k) the applicant's proposals relating to—*
 - (i) the sale and supply of non-alcoholic drinks and food; and*
 - (ii) the sale and supply of low-alcohol drinks; and*
 - (iii) the provision of help with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises:*
- (l) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, the Medical Officer of Health, or an inspector made under [section 141](#).*

Section 143 Additional requirements for large-scale events

(1) If, in the opinion of the licensing committee concerned, an application for a special licence relates to a large-scale event, the committee may do any or all of the following:

- (a) require the applicant to provide the committee with a management plan describing how the applicant proposes to deal with matters such as security, monitoring, interaction with local residents, and public health concerns:*
- (b) require the applicant to provide the committee with a certificate by the territorial authority that the proposed use of the premises meets the requirements of the [Resource Management Act 1991](#) and of the building code:*
- (c) require the applicant to liaise with the Police and the territorial authority on planning for the event.*

(2) In deciding whether to issue a special licence, the licensing committee concerned may have regard to the following matters (in addition to the matters stated in [section 142\(1\)](#)):

(a) whether, and how well, the applicant has complied with any requirement under subsection (1)(a):

(b) whether, and how well, the applicant has complied with any requirement under subsection (1)(c), and whether the Police and the territorial authority are satisfied with any liaison that has taken place.

The committee is satisfied as to the matters to which it must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and also those matters requiring the committee's consideration under section 143 of the Act.

As noted above the applicant has provided an alcohol management plan detailing risk management, provision of food, low and non-alcoholic beverages, certificated managers and bar staff requirements, transport options and accidents/incidents management.

The committee is satisfied with the liaison that has occurred between the applicant and the Council's liquor licensing department and with the Police on planning for the event.

Finally the committee comes to the matter of compliance with the Resource Management Act 1991 and the building code. The event is covered under the original RMA certificate issued to the ASB Leisure Centre. The committee has been advised that no further applications for RMA or a Building Code Certificate are required.

The committee is satisfied with the matters to which it must have regard and grants an on-site special licence to the applicant subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours: **Between the hours of 5.00pm and 12.00midnight on 13 September 2014.**
2. Alcohol may be sold or supplied to the following types of people: **Persons attending the event.**
3. The fees payable for the licence concerned are: **\$575.00 GST inclusive.**
4. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed: **No sales to minors or intoxicated persons; appropriate signage displayed; evidence of age documents must be requested when deemed necessary; door staff required.**
5. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the management of premises are observed: **Managers to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance. Names of duty managers to be displayed.**
6. Drinking water must be freely available at the following places while the premises are open for business: **From water dispensers and on each table.**
7. Where the principal business carried out on the premises is not the manufacture or sale of alcohol, the kinds of alcohol that may be sold or delivered on or from the premises are: **RTDs, wine and beer.**
8. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: **A catered three course meal for corporate tables and canteen food menu is displayed and actively promoted on the premises.**
9. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as follows: **Low alcohol beer.**
10. Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as follows: **Soft drinks, tea, coffee and water.**
11. The licensee must take the following steps to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises: **Pro-drive and taxi number displayed.**
12. Members of the public must be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances: **N/A.**
13. Alcohol may be sold in the following types of container only: **Standard glasses/bottles.**

14. The licence is also subject to the following conditions, which in the committee's opinion are not inconsistent with the Act: **All aspects of the event must be managed in accordance with the steps prescribed in the Alcohol Management Plan supplied in support of the application**
