DECISION (ON THE PAPERS)

This is an application by **Richard John Scotland** for an on-site special licence in respect of premises situated at the **Coronation Hall, 45 The Centre, Waipu**, for an event known as the Art N Tartan Wearable Arts Award 2014.

It is an annual event to showcase creative endeavour from around New Zealand. This year's event will be split in to three shows which includes opening night' performance, an afternoon 'matinee performance' and the final 'awards evening' of light and sound. The point of sale is from the bar in the Waipu Coronation Hall. This is a ticket only event. About 250 people are expected to attend. The days and times sought for the special licence are as follows:

Friday 27 June 2014	7.00 pm to 12.00 midnight	Opening night
Saturday 28 June 2014	1.00 pm to 4.30 pm	Matinee
Saturday 28 June 2014	7.00 pm to 12.00 midnight	Award show

Richard John Scotland (002/CM/8/2002) is the applicant and duty manger of the events. He has been working as the duty manager for Waipu Golf Club for the past twelve years. The bar staff who will assist behind the bar are trained in Host Responsibility provision under the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. This is a ticket entry event.

The committee has received reports on the application from the Police, the Medical Officer of Health and the Licensing Inspector and none have raised matters in opposition. Further more the application did not require public notice. Accordingly we deal with the matters on the papers

Section 142 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 provides that in deciding whether or not to issue a special licence, the licensing committee must have regard to the following matters :

(a) the object of this Act:

(b) the nature of the particular event for which the licence is sought and, in particular,—

(i) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes at the event to engage in, the sale of goods other than alcohol, low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which goods; and

(ii) whether the applicant is engaged in, or proposes at the event to engage in, the provision of services other than those directly related to the sale of alcohol,

low-alcohol refreshments, non-alcoholic refreshments, and food, and if so, which services:

(c) the suitability of the applicant:

(d) any relevant local alcohol policy:

(e) whether (in its opinion) the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be reduced, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of the issue of the licence:

(f) the days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol:

(g) the design and layout of the premises concerned:

(h) whether the applicant has appropriate systems, staff and training to comply with the law:

(i) any areas of the premises that the applicant proposes should be designated as restricted areas or supervised areas:

(j) any steps the applicant proposes to take to ensure that the requirements of this Act in relation to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:

(k) the applicant's proposals relating to—

(i) the sale and supply of non-alcoholic drinks and food; and

(ii) the sale and supply of low-alcohol drinks; and

(iii) the provision of help with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises:

(l) any matters dealt with in any report from the Police, the Medical Officer of Health, or an inspector made under section 141.

DECISION

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.142 of the Act and we grant the applicant an on-site special licence subject to the following conditions.

1. Alcohol may be sold under the licence only on the following days and during the following hours: **27 June and 28 June 2014 between 7.00pm to 12.00 midnight; 28 June 2014 between 1.00pm and 4.30pm.**
2. Alcohol may be sold or supplied to the following types of people: **Persons attending the event.**
3. The fees payable for the licence concerned are: **\$207.00 GST inclusive.**
4. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the sale or supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed: **No sales to minors or intoxicated persons; appropriate signage displayed; evidence of age documents must be requested when deemed necessary.**
5. The licensee must take the following steps to ensure that the provisions of this Act relating to the management of premises are observed: **Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance. Name of duty manager to be displayed.**
6. **The whole of the premises is designated as a supervised area.**
7. Drinking water must be freely available at the following places while the premises are open for business: **At the bar.**
8. Where the principal business carried out on the premises is not the manufacture or sale of alcohol, the kinds of alcohol that may be sold or delivered on or from the premises are: **RTD's, spirits, wine and beer.**
9. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: **Finger food available at all time when the premises are open for business.**
10. Low-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as follows: **Low alcohol beer.**
11. Non-alcohol beverages must be available for sale and supply on the premises as follows: **Non-alcohol punch fruit juices, soft drinks, tea, coffee and water.**
12. The licensee must take the following steps to provide assistance with or information about alternative forms of transport from the premises: **Signage for taxi service.**
13. Members of the public must be excluded from the premises in the following circumstances: **Ticket entry event, unaccompanied minors are excluded.**

14. Alcohol may be sold in the following types of container only: **Standard glasses.**
