The Ngatiwai Trust Board is the mandated authority for Te Iwi o Ngatiwai (The Tribe of Ngatiwai). Te Iwi o Ngatiwai exercises mana whenua (authority over land) and mana moana (authority over the ocean) over its area, which extends from Tapaka Point in the Bay of Islands to Takatu Point (South Omaha) and encompasses the eastern seaboard and all offshore islands, including Aotea (Great Barrier) in the Hauraki Gulf.
