1. Resident and Ratepayer Administration Grants 2010/2011

Introduction

Each year resident and ratepayer groups within the District are invited to apply for Whangarei District Council's \$500 Resident and Ratepayer Administration Grant. Groups applying for the grant are required to provide the following information:

- a) A copy of their Certificate of Incorporation (or that of an 'umbrella' organisation)
- b) A list of current office holders and the number of members
- c) Written details of their activities over the past six months
- d) Proposed activities for the next six months
- e) A copy of their most recent set of accounts

The budget allocated for the 2010/2011 year is \$10,000.

2010/2011 Applications

In November 2010, 20 resident and ratepayer groups within the District were invited to apply for the 2010-2011 administration grant. Applications closed on Friday 11 February 2011. 19 applications were received; 18 from groups invited to apply and one first time applicant.

Of the 19 applications received, the following 18 groups meet the criteria:

The following application from a first time applicant did not meet the criteria:

• Te Runanga a Iwi o Te Oranga Ake (TOA)

This organisation is a nationwide charitable trust whose primary focus is to provide services across the fields of health, education, social services/justice and finance. In Whangarei, the organisation promotes fortnightly activities for children and youth in the Otangarei area. They have requested the grant to cover administration costs of providing these activities for the next six months. Although the organisation works for the benefit of children and youth in Otangarei, it is not set up to specifically advocate to Council on issues relating to a particular group of local residents and ratepayers. Therefore, it is recommended that the application be declined on the grounds that it is not eligible for funding from this particular fund, and that staff communicate other available funding options to the group.

Two groups who were invited to apply, but did not do so are:

- Parua Bay Community Focus Group
 - The group confirmed that they were still active but did not have a foreseeable need for the grant in the coming year so would not apply.
- Smeaton Drive Community House did not respond to the invitation.

The total amount requested is \$9,500. The total amount recommended for disbursement is \$9,000, which is within budget.

Introduction







Through recieving the scolarship I was able to buy a laptop which has continuously helped me with assignments during the course of the year.


