# Dog Registration fees are due by 31 July 2024

#### Registration

All dog owners with dogs ordinarily kept in the Whangārei District must register their dogs with Whangarei District Council.
All dogs must be registered before they reach the age of 12 weeks. If you are found to have an unregistered dog at any time you may be liable for a \$300 infringement. It is an offence to keep an unregistered dog that is older than 12 weeks of age. If any dog is first required to be registered after 1 August in any registration year, the fee shall be 1/12th of the annual fee for each month remaining in the registration year after the date of such registration.

# Discounted fees for desexed dog

Owners wishing to claim a reduced fee for dogs neutered in the last 12 months must produce a certificate from a veterinarian at the time the dog is registered certifying that the dog has been neutered. If the dog has been registered the reduced fee won't apply till the following registration year.

### Change of ownership

On change of ownership of any registered dog, both the previous owner and the new owner must, within 14 days, give written notice to Whangarei District Council of the change of ownership and the residential address of the new owner and the address at which the dog will be kept. It is an offence not to comply with this requirement.

If the owner's address is changed within the District, the owner must, within 14 days, give written notice of the change to Whangarei District Council.

# Refund of fees if dog dies

If your dog passes away, you need to notify us in writing or visit our Customer Service Centres (9 Rust Avenue or Ruakākā), and specifically request a refund. It is important that you do this as soon as possible, as the refunds are calculated on the number of full months left in the registration year, from the date we receive your written notification. The written request for a refund needs to be accompanied by either:

- a signed declaration form attesting that the dog has passed away.
- a certificate or an invoice from a Veterinary Clinic confirming that the dog has passed away.

You will also need to provide proof of your bank account as all refunds are made to the owner's bank account. Refunds are not available if your dog changes ownership or you sign your dog over to animal management.

#### Impounding dogs

If any dog over the age of 12 weeks is found not wearing a collar with a current registration label on land or premises other than its owner's land or premises, or in any public place, the dog may be seized and impounded. The owner of a dog must keep the dog under control at all times and, when in a public place with the dog, must use or carry a leash at all times.

# **Microchipping**

Any dog that is registered for the first time on or after 1 July 2006 must have a microchip transponder implanted. If your dog is found not complying with this, you may be liable for a \$300 fine. Microchipping is a once-only process; it is painless to the dog and takes only about two minutes to complete. If your dog is lost and taken to a Dog Control Officer anywhere within New Zealand he/she is able to identify the dog and then immediately contact you.

#### Note

# Summary

As a dog owner it is your responsibility to:

- ensure your dog is registered and microchipped
- provide your dog with exercise, shelter, food, and clean water
- keep your dog under control at all times, and always have your dog on leash in public places (except for designated dog exercise areas)
- always supervise your dog around young children and / or strangers.

<u>Be aware</u> that in general, a Council must disqualify a person from being an owner of a dog if the person commits 3 or more infringement offences (not relating to a single incident or occasion) within a continuous period of 24 months.
